- 1. Simeon 2.25-35
 - 1.1 Simeon's waiting:
 - 1.1.1 Righteous and devout while "waiting for the consolation of Jerusalem"
 - 1.1.2 The Holy Spirit was upon him, he was moved by the Holy Spirit
 - 1.2 Simeon's rejoicing:
 - 1.2.1 Promise of God for Jerusalem fulfilled
 - 1.2.2 Personal promise for him fulfilled
- 2. Anna, prophetess, daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher 2.36-38
 - 2.1 Anna's waiting:
 - 1.2.1 Long widowhood
 - 1.2.2 Never left the temple day and night in worship
 - 1.2.3 Life of fasting and prayer
 - 2.2 Anna's thanksgiving
 - 2.1.2 Spoke about the child to all who were looking forward to the redemption of Jerusalem. (Redemption of Jerusalem has to do with the reception of the child)
- 3. Joseph and Mary -2.21-24; 39-40 Cf: Leviticus 12.1-8, Exodus 13.2.12,15.

Luke 2.40. And the child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom and the grace of God was upon him.
